Overview

This Knowledge Base Article discusses steps for completing a **CAPM Safety Assessment**. The **Safety Assessment** is completed for Screened In/Screened In AR intakes with an Intake type of CA/N, Dependency, and Family in Need of Services (Stranger Danger). The **Safety Assessment** allows users to review specific safety factors and identify safety threats for the child participants. After identifying safety threats, reviewing historical information, and considering child vulnerabilities protective capacities, the user can then determine a safety response for the child participants. If needed, the user can also designate a safety plan.

To complete a **Safety Assessment**, complete the following steps.

Adding Child Participants

When completing a **Safety Assessment**, the user must add child participants. The participants are selected from a list of active case members. The Family Information section of the **Safety Assessment** includes guidance about who should be linked to the **Safety Assessment**. All children in the family should be included on the **Safety Assessment** even if they were not included on the intake. Once a case member has been added to the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will no longer appear on the **Available Participants** list. If he/she is deleted from the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will return to the list of **Available Participants**. After adding a child, the user selects applicable **Child Vulnerabilities**.



The Family Information section of the **Safety Assessment** includes guidance about who should be linked to the **Safety Assessment**. Adults in the home, who have caretaking responsibilities, should be included on the **Safety Assessment** even if they were not included on the intake. Once a case member has been added to the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will no longer appear on the **Available Participants** list. 




