

Knowledge Base Article

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Overview

This Knowledge Base Article discusses steps for completing a **CAPM Safety Assessment**. The **Safety Assessment** is completed for Screened In/Screened In AR intakes with an Intake type of CA/N, Dependency, and Family in Need of Services (Stranger Danger). The **Safety Assessment** allows users to review specific safety factors and identify safety threats for the child participants. After identifying safety threats, reviewing historical information, and considering child vulnerabilities protective capacities, the user can then determine a safety response for the child participants. If needed, the user can also designate a safety plan.

To complete a **Safety Assessment**, complete the following steps.

Navigating to the case

1. From the Ohio SACWIS Home screen, click **Case**.

Adding Child Participants

When completing a **Safety Assessment**, the user must add child participants. The participants are selected from a list of active case members. The Family Information section of the **Safety Assessment** includes guidance about who should be linked to the **Safety Assessment**. All children in the family should be included on the **Safety Assessment** even if they were not included on the intake. Once a case member has been added to the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will no longer appear on the **Available Participants** list. If he/she is deleted from the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will return to the list of **Available Participants**. After adding a child, the user selects applicable **Child Vulnerabilities**.





The Family Information section of the **Safety Assessment** includes guidance about who should be linked to the **Safety Assessment**. Adults in the home, who have caretaking responsibilities, should be included on the **Safety Assessment** even if they were not included on the intake. Once a case member has been added to the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will no longer appear on the **Available Participants** list. Once a case member has been added to the **Safety Assessment**, his/her name will no longer appear on the **Available Participants** list. Reviewing Historical Intake Summary

Once child and/or adult participants have been added to the **Safety Assessment**, the **Historical Summary** tab will populate with **Historical Intake Information** for the participants. The page is divided into 2 sections: **Historical Intake Summary for Children in the Family** and **Historical Intake Summary for Adult Participants**. The participants under each section display **Name**, **Person ID**, **Gender**, **Age**, **DOB**, and the number of intake records found.

All the intakes with this child as an ACV/CSR or AP/ASR are displayed.

Each Intake displays with the Intake ID, Category, Type, Decision Date, Case/Date.

There will be a card displayed for each allegation on the intake.

drawer. Once an intake has been viewed in the **Intake Details Pane**, the (v) icon will display next to that intake.

Note: For Safety Factor 10 regarding Sexual Abuse, if the Alleged Perpetrator has access to the Alleged Child Victim, the system will mark this as an Active Safety Threat and disable the dropdown.

7. Click **Next** to navigate to the next Safety Factor.

Note: Safety Factor 2a will only display if Safety Factor 2 indicates there were inflicted physical injuries. If there were not inflicted physical injuries, Safety Factor 2a will be hidden.




